COMMUNITY PLANNING COMMITTEE TO HOLD PUBLIC INPUT SESSIONS ON MARCH 8

Jefferson City, MO - Residents, property owners, business owners and those interested in neighborhood betterment in and around Old Munichburg, Southside, Lincoln University and Jefferson City High School are invited to attend a public input session at Capital Region Medical Center on Tuesday, March 8 in the Tunnell/Wherritt community Conference Center from 6:00 – 8:00 pm.

During this input session representatives from H3 studios will lead discussions through a workshop designed to reveal the needs of the community to develop solutions for neighborhood enhancement.

This will be the first of 4 public forums to be held between March and May. The events will include sessions designed to draw on ideas, experiences and perceptions of participants as well as sessions to reveal proposed plans for redevelopment.

An advisory board of property owners, business owners, residents, and civic and community leaders has partnered with H3 Studios, a national award-winning, St. Louis-based design and planning firm that offers a highly-specialized approach to projects in public and private sectors. Project elements include sustainability and urban design, coding, landscape, and architectural professional services. Input and participation from those within the neighborhood are vital to creating safe, inviting areas, for working and living.

"Capital Region Medical Center initiated a community study with H3 studios because we feel a strong obligation to invest in the community around us. We are here to promote the health and wellness for the people and communities we serve and that starts with vibrant healthy environments," says CRMC President, Gaspare Calvaruso "It's our goal for this project to gain momentum and for those involved to become engaged and take the lead to improve our neighborhood and community."
