### Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

- Established as an Entitlement Community in 2004
- Receive a grant annually contingent upon Congress approval of federal budget
- 2023 CDBG grant is \$268,051

## Consolidated Plan Purpose

- Assess affordable housing & community development needs;
- Serves as a framework to identify priorities;
- Community develops its own programs and funding priorities through the Consolidated Plan;
- Funding must benefit low to moderate income persons.

## Consolidated Plan Purpose (cont.)

- Activities must meet one of the following national objectives:
  - o 1. Benefit Low-and-Moderate Income (LMI) persons
    - ➤ The low-and-moderate income (LMI) national objective is the primary national objective because the statute requires that grantees expend 70% of the CDBG funds to meet the LMI national objective.

#### LMI Calculation Example:

Total entitlement grant amount	\$268,051
Less actual planning and admin (up to 20%)	(\$53,610.20)
Equals amount subject to LMI calculation	\$214,440.80
Multiplied by 70 percent	<u>x0.70</u>
Equals minimum to benefit LMI:	\$150,108.56

Amount subject to LMI calculation: \$214,440.80 Less LMI minimum \$216,108.56

Equals maximum slum/blight & urgent needs allowable activities: \$64,332.24

## Consolidated Plan Purpose (cont.)

- o 2. Elimination of slum and blight;
  - ➤ The first method occurs when a structure is blighted; when it exhibits objectively determinable signs of deterioration to constitute a threat to health, safety and public welfare.
  - ➤ The second method covers area blight, and includes submitting a resolution or ordinance passed by City Council declaring the area blighted in accordance with 24 CFR 570. A good example is the East Capitol Avenue Area Urban Renewal Plan that was adopted by Council in December of 2016.
- o 3. Urgent Threat to Health and Safety (Urgent Need)
  - Urgent need is generally for activities to alleviate emergency conditions. Examples include:
    - Acquisition of property located in a flood plain that was severely damaged by a recent flood;
    - Public facility improvements like the reconstruction of a publicly-owned hospital that was severely damaged by a tornado;
    - Demolition of structures that are severely damaged by a major earthquake.

## Having the Greatest Impact

- In the 2019-2023 Consolidated Plan the following activities were designated as goals:
  - Homebuyer Assistance:
    - Goal was to assist 56 households
    - ➤ Households served was 87
  - Emergency Assistance Repair Program
    - Goal was to assist 52 households
    - Households served was 15
  - Removal of dilapidated structures
    - ▼ Goal was to demolish 10-15 structures
    - Structures demolished was 8
  - Infrastructure Projects
    - Goal was to assist 15,000 persons
    - Persons assisted was 6,000
      - E. Miller & Chestnut Streets sidewalks improvement project.
      - o Adams and Hickory Street sidewalk improvement project. Near completion.
  - Public Services
    - ▼ Public Service Activities other than Low to Moderate Income Housing Benefit
      - o Goal was to assist 10 persons
      - Actual number assisted was o

## Having the Greatest Impact (cont.)

- Public Services Category
  - ➤ Can allocate up to 15% of annual funds on Public Service Activities
  - Sub-grant to local not-for-profit agencies with low-to-moderate income persons
  - ➤ Must be a quantifiable increase of an existing service and/or a new program for the agency
  - Funding is contingent on award from HUD
- Eligible Activities
  - Basic social services to the homeless and low-to-moderate income persons;
  - ➤ Food and nutrition services for low-to-moderate income persons. **The purchase of food is ineligible**;
  - **▼** Domestic violence prevention and counseling services;
  - ▼ Job training and employment services for low-to-moderate income persons;

## Having the Greatest Impact (cont.)

- Eligible Activities (cont.)
  - ➤ Health care and substance abuse services for low-to-moderate income persons;
  - **▼** Child care for low-to-moderate income families;
  - Services for senior citizens (62 and over exclusively);
  - Services for the disabled persons;
  - **▼** Fair housing counseling.
- A workshop will be made available to sub-recipients, if the Public Services activity is funded.
