The City's past programs have focused on community needs that continue to exist including aging housing, infrastructure, and neighborhood improvements. The programs the city has used to address these needs have been well received by residents and neighborhood organizations.

A review of past Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Reports (CAPER) from 2019 to 2022 revealed a strong focus on community needs that continue to exist including aging housing, infrastructure, and neighborhood improvements.
